Prerequisite - None – No Formal Assessment Required, Open to ALL Students

Beginning level chorus will provide for the study of correct vocal production and development of musicianship through the study of appropriate choral literature. Course content includes a study of choral literature, vocal techniques and sight singing. Based on successful completion of sequential concepts for each level, students will continue as specified in course level. Rehearsals and performances, both in and out of school, are required. There is no required audition for this course.

SHOW/SWING CHOIR (Beginning - Light Touch)

Grades 9 - 12

Prerequisite: None – No Formal Assessment Required, Open to ALL Students

Students are offered an beginning/intermediate choral experience in the appropriate genres. They develop both musicianship and proficiency in ensemble performance. Course content includes a study of choral literature, vocal techniques, sight singing and choreography. Based on successful completion of sequential concepts for each level, students will continue as specified in course level. This group may occasionally meet after school. As a co-curricular class, rehearsals and performances, both in and out of school, are required. There is no required audition for this course.

On Average, Music Students Score Higher on Tests!

“Students of the arts continue to outperform their non-arts peers on the SAT. In 2000, SAT takers with coursework/experience in music performance scored 57 points higher on the verbal portion of the test and 41 points higher on the math portion than students with no coursework/experience in the arts.”

With an average combined increase of almost 100 points, access to music study could make the difference in gaining admission to a student’s college of choice.

In education there is, of course, an ongoing discussion of how intelligence and learning is assessed and what the outcomes mean. Music comes into play here as well. UCLA professor Dr. James Catterall led an analysis of a U.S. Department of Education database used to track more than 25,000 students over a period of ten years. The study showed that students involved in music generally tested higher than those who had no musical involvement. The test scores studied were not only standardized tests, such as the SAT, but also reading-proficiency exams. The study also noted that the musicians scored higher no matter what socioeconomic group was studied.
